Municipal utility organization elects directors and officers for 2007-08

LUDLOW, Mass. – May 11, 2007 – The Massachusetts Municipal Wholesale Electric Company (MMWEC) elected three directors and its corporate officers for 2007-08 at the organization's annual meeting on May 10 in Boylston.

Stanley W. Herriott, manager of the Ashburnham Municipal Light Department, was elected by the MMWEC membership to his second three-year term on the MMWEC Board of Directors.
