MMWEC elects directors and officers for 2008-09

LUDLOW, Mass. – May 16, 2008 – The Massachusetts Municipal Wholesale Electric Company (MMWEC) recently elected four directors and its corporate officers for 2008-09.

Ashburnham Municipal Light Department Manager Stanley W. Herriott, serving his second three-year term as a director of MMWEC, was elected Chairman of the MMWEC Board of Directors.

H. Bradford White, manager of the West Boylston Municipal Light Department, was reelected by the MMWEC membership to his third one-year term as President of the MMWEC organization.

James M. Lavelle, manager of the Holyoke Gas & Electric Department; Robert V. Jolly, Jr., general manager of the Marblehead Municipal Light Department; and Jonathan V. Fitch, manager of the Princeton Municipal Light Department, were reelected by the MMWEC membership to three-year terms as MMWEC Directors.

In addition, Thomas R. Josie, general manager of Shrewsbury's Electric & Cable Operations, was elected by the membership to complete the one year remaining on the unexpired term of an MMWEC director who retired earlier this year.

The newly elected directors join MMWEC's other board members, which in addition to Herriott include William F. Waters, general manager of the Peabody Municipal Light Plant, and Sean Hamilton, general manager of the Templeton Municipal Light & Water Plant.

Michael J. Flynn and Paul Robbins, both of Wilbraham, serve on the board as gubernatorial appointees. Flynn also represents the Town of Wilbraham on the board, with Luis Vitorino and John M. Flynn representing the towns of Ludlow and Hampden, respectively.
